Each year OEHA sponsors conferences covering topics which may include many diverse environmental health topics. The speakers for these educational conferences are recruited not only from Oregon, but also from other parts of the U.S. Speakers come from local, state, federal agencies, universities, and private industries.

Throughout the year, OEHA plays an active role in environmental health policy development in the State or Oregon. We have active members serving on and/or advising to several legislative advisory committees such as: Oregon Drinking Water Advisory Committee, the Committee of Local Environmental Health Supervisors, the Oregon Health Licensing Agency, etc. Whenever policy issues arise, we act to protect both our profession and the quality of public health in Oregon.

Benevolent activities, which are primarily funded with donations, include presenting scholarships to youth pursuing a profession in Environmental Health. Examples include the Intel® Northwest Science Expo (<http://www.nwse.org/>) and a general scholarship for financial assistance for unpaid college interns demonstrating need. Money has also been raised and donated to Public Health International (<http://publichealthinternational.org/>) to support their efforts to raise environmental public health standards in developing communities around the world.

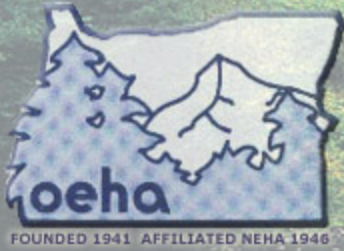
